


JOIN WEDNESDAY LENTEN GATHERINGS IN PERSON OR ON 700M

Home Remedy is a folk-pop musical duo featuring Melinda Monroe on vocals and guitar and Cindy Minnis on vocals, keyboard, and percussion. Both have rich alto voices and the ability to harmonize in such a pleasing way.



Melinda and Cindy play both original music and covers (Mary Chapin Carpenter, Linda Ronstadt, John Denver, Boudleaux Bryant, etc.).
